## Call for Evidence: the Sector's Contribution to Addressing the Youth Employment Challenge

ERSA is undertaking a new research project on the history of the sector's delivery of programmes and projects to address youth unemployment and economic inactivity.

At ERSA, we know that the employment support sector has the knowledge, skills and experience to address these challenges. The sector has delivered a consistent history of youth interventions. Together we have the institutional memory, ERSA will record it for policy makers and commissioners to demonstrate the rich tapestry of delivery, the evidence of what was achieved, what worked, the things we wouldn't want to repeat and our recommendations for the Youth Guarantee. Most importantly ERSA will illustrate the role the sector should play. The report will be launched in January 2025.
